Tessa Zappa advocates for Tri-Solfen for enhanced animal welfare and faster wound healing.

The Zappas operate Hillside, a Merino and Wagyu farm in Willow Tree, rural NSW. Situated on the New England Highway halfway between Scone and Tamworth, Willow Tree is home to a tight-knit farming community of just 308 residents.

But despite its size, the area is a flourishing local destination – more than doubling its population on weekends thanks to visitors coming in from surrounding regions.

Its here, surrounded by enviable countryside, that the Zappa family runs 3,000 Merino sheep for meat and wool, a couple of hundred cross-bred sheep and some F1 Wagyu cattle to sell directly to a feed lot.

Taking a chance on Tri-Solfen.

It was Tessa's dad that first heard about Tri-Solfen and thought they should give it a try.

The Zappas tend to begin their annual marking season in October – when the weather is beginning to warm up.

It meant that flies would swarm around fresh blood or open wounds, increasing the risk of infection and disease.

"We also have a couple of hundred cross breed sheep and we don't use Tri-Solfen on them if ear marking or castrating. We really noticed the difference in using it on our Merino sheep."
